What's New in Standards, Legislation & Guidelines

WSIB - 2016 Premiums Rates Maintained

The WSIB is well positioned to continue providing premium rate stability. 2016 premium rates will be maintained at current levels for all employers. The WSIB Maximum Insurable Earnings Ceiling for 2016 is \$88,000. This is an increase of



3.3% from \$85,200 in 2015. Changes to the Maximum Insurable Earnings Ceiling are directly linked to changes in average earnings in Ontario as measured by Statistics Canada, and provisions under the Workplace Safety and Insurance Act.

The deadline for submissions for the Rate Framework Modernization Consultation was October 2, 2015. Since the launch of the consultation, two technical sessions and over 60 working group sessions were held. WSIB is to review submissions and assess stakeholder input on implications of the proposed preliminary Rate Framework, and will hold a "What We've Heard" session with key stakeholders/participants in fall 2015. Joint Health and Safety Committee (JHSC) Certification Training Standards will come into effect March 1, 2016.



The new JHSC Certification Training Program Standard along with the new JHSC Certification Training Provider Standard will result in a number of changes to the certification process.

What has not changed?

The requirement to have one worker and one management JHSC member certified. Learn about JHSC requirements here: http://bit.ly/10gogrc.

Part 1 training requirement generic to all workplaces required for both employer and worker certified members, regardless of workplace sector. Including health and safety legislation and general duties of JHSC members and certified members.

Part 1 training delivered by an approved provider.

Part 2 training on the hazards relevant to their own workplaces covering the concepts of hazard recognition, assessment, and control, and evaluation of hazard controls.

What is New?

 The certification process will take five days with the minimum duration of the training programs being set in the standard:

Part 1 Training - 3 days or 19.5 hours Part 2 Training - 2 days or 13 hours

 The standard now requires a Refresher every three (3) years to maintain your certification status. This refresher must be 1 day or 6.5 hours.

- JHSC members will be required to complete JHSC Part 1 and 2 Training withain a 6 month period.
- Part 2 training will be formalized; requiring the training program to be approved as well as the training provider.
 There is a requirement of a minimum of 6 hazards to be included in the Part 2 training.
 - A list of all CPO-approved JHSC certification training providers will be posted to the Ministry of Labour (MOL) website in winter 2016 as they are approved.
- There is now a requirement of a minimum of 6 participants in a class to a maximum of 25 participants.

PSHSA will be offering JHSC Certification Part 1 & Part 2 training meeting the new standard starting March 1st, 2016 when the Ministry of Labour approvals granted come into effect.

The 1996 JHSC training standards remain in effect until the new training standards come into force. The requirements for the new JHSC training standards will not be applicable to anyone who received their certification under the current 1996 training standard.

Be sure to register for Part 1 AND 2 because BOTH must be completed by February 29th, 2016 (under the current 1996 training standard) to qualify for certification and be exempt from completing the refresher every 3 years.

Mandatory Awareness Training

As of July 1, 2014, every employer must ensure their workers and supervisors complete a basic occupational health and safety awareness training program.

PSHSA offers both Supervisor and Worker Health & Safety Awareness training via eLearning and



classroom courses. The training will enhance general awareness of legislated health and safety responsibilities, including the Internal Responsibility System, worker rights as well as the supervisor's role in workplace management.

Upon completion of the training, participants will understand the requirements of Regulation 297/13 and will be informed on how to recognize, assess and control workplace hazards and how to evaluate such controls. These courses are applicable across all sectors, and will provide certificates upon completion.

If you are considering adding to your workforce in preparation for the holiday season, this training is also required for those new workers.

Health and Safety Spotlight



Since October is Global Ergonomics Month what better time to consider an Ergonomic Assessment for your workplace as part of an effective health and safety program.

Musculoskeletal disorders (MSD) are injuries or disorders of the musculoskeletal system involving muscles, tendons, ligaments, joints or nerves and account for 50% of all lost-



time injuries in Ontario. An effective approach to MSD prevention reduces the demands of the job to the abilities of the employee through proper design of workstations, tools, environment, work schedules, policies and procedures. Employers are legally required to take every reasonable precaution to protect workers from hazards including MSD injuries. The MSD prevention guideline, announced in February 2007 outlines employers' obligations including elements of a MSD prevention program. As well the Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHSA) and regulations relate to MSD prevention and ergonomics.

In an effort to help you reduce MSD-type injuries, PSHSA offers a variety of ergonomic services, including:

- Ergonomic Assessments To identify ergonomics risk factors, determine the level of risk present in a job and provide suggestions to minimize the risk of injury
- Physical Demands Descriptions (PDD's) An in-depth description of the physical demands and environmental conditions associated with job performance


WHMIS 2015

- Describe the purpose, content and function of a Safety Data Sheet (SDS)
- Describe the hazards associated with controlled products
- Describe the legal rights and duties under WHMIS 2015







